
A Great Big Cuddle






Not Now, Bernard

If it had been up to her I'd have read it even more frequently. Each time I got to the end, she pleaded for us to begin again. This is another wish fulfillment story, only for toddlers. A tiger turns up at the door and is invited in for tea by Sophie's mum. It proceeds to eat its way through everything in the kitchen and pantry before departing with the same enigmatic smile. Sophie's father turns up, graciously accepts that a fully-grown tiger has eaten his dinner and takes Sophie and her mum out for a meal. Pure genius."
